CERFTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

A Certificate of Completion is given to all first year students at the end of the school year for successfully meeting the following requirements:

- **1.** The assigned courses must be satisfactorily completed.
- 2. A cumulative grade point average of 70% must be maintained.
- **3.** Class attendance requirements as outlined in the handbook must be fulfilled.
- **4.** Every student must give evidence of true Christian life & character during the school year at **EIWTC** in order to be recommended by the faculty for a certificate.

GRADUATION

To be eligible to receive a diploma for the second-year program, a student must meet the following requirements.

- **1.** The assigned courses must be satisfactorily completed.
- **2.** A cumulative grade point average of 75% must be maintained.
- 3. Class attendance requirements as outlined in the handbook must be fulfilled.
- 4. Every candidate for graduation must give evidence of true Christian life and character during the school year at **EIWTC** in order to be recommended by the faculty for graduation.

5. Each online graduate can choose to receive their diploma in person at our annual graduation ceremony or they can participate through internet and have their diploma mailed to them.

STUDENT POLICIES

All Training Center rules apply to both first and secondyear students. It is anticipated that second-year students will conduct themselves in a manner that will be an example to the first-year students.

CONDUCT

The establishment of worthy standards of life is necessary for every believer. Thus, Christian character is a vital concern of this Training Center. We believe it is the responsibility of the student engaged in training to live an exemplary life. It is expected that students will avoid practices and forms of entertainment which will be detrimental to personal growth in the Christian life.

Any online interaction between students should be positive and respectful. Any student conducting themselves online that is disparaging to other students or to E.IW.T.C. are subject to immediate removal from the school following an administrative review.

<u>Cheating</u>

Every person who enrolls in this school should understand that to submit work which is not his/her own violates the purpose of this School of Ministry and the individual's purpose in being here. If an instructor suspects that a student has **borrowed** or **copied**, the work will not be accepted. **Any form of cheating will subject the student to an "F" in the course and possible dismissal from school.**

CLASS ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance is required in all classes. **WE DO NOT EXPECT YOU TO BE ABSENT.** Each online student should expect to spend a minimum of 6 hours of time each week to view their classes and do the quizzes following online. There may be other reading assignments given.

Absences

Online students have the flexibility to view classes "live" or by "archive." There is a 7 day period for the student to finish their work for each class.

Absentees for online students are tracked by the online quiz following each lesson. A 100% score on the quiz must be obtained by 2 attempts in order to be counted present and receive credit for that class.

Any student who fails to accomplish their online quiz for 3 or more days without an excused absence will be required to schedule a meeting with the Dean for a review of the absences along with possible disciplinary action.

Excused absences are absences that result from extreme circumstances (i.e., illness under doctor's care, death in the immediate family, etc.)

Due to the flexibility that the online school provides, EI-WTC expects all online students to complete all their quizzes/work for all classes within the given 7 day period.

<u>QUIZZES:</u>

Each online student MUST complete the online quiz for each class viewed online to receive credit for that particular class. The online quiz will be available 24 hours after the "live" class is over.

Online students have the option to watch classes "live" on the class nights or watch the video archives posted 24 hours after the "live" class. The online quiz for each class will also be posted 24 hours after the "live" class.

It is recommended to print out the online quiz and answer the questions while you view the video "archive" of the class. Then go back and enter your answers online afterwards.

If you do not have a printer, another alternative is to open a second web browser and log in a second time and have the quiz open and answer the questions as you watch the class "archive" video. MP3 downloads of the class are also available.

EXAMS:

4 exams will be given each semester to determine your grade for the course.

Exam formats may differ from instructor to instructor.

Most exams will have time limits to complete the work. Make sure that you clear your schedule for the 10—15 minutes that will be needed to take your exam. You must complete your exam and submit your answers within the given time limit to receive credit for your answers. <u>Please e-mail your instruc-</u> tor immediately if you experience any technical difficulties with your exams. Exams will be posted on Tuesday night of exam week and will remain on the site till Sunday evening. Late exams can be taken after the 5 day period but will be penalized up to 25%.

ASSIGNMENTS

All assignments must be e-mailed to the instructor by the deadline given by the instructor.

Late or incomplete assignments are subject to grade penalties.

Assignments should be submitted in Microsoft Word 2000 format. If you are not able to submit your work in Microsoft Word 2000 format, Then using your own Word Processor program, save your assignment in "Rich Text Format". Do this by "save as" and then Choose "Rich Text Format (RTF)" as the format to save the file in.

You will then need to e-mail that file to your instructor. "Rich Text Format" files can be easily opened by any word processor program.
